

AHA BOARD OF REVIEW FOR AHA GRADUATING STUDENTS 2011

Graduating Students are at the Rhetoric stage in a Liberal Arts education. To be competent in rhetoric means they can communicate their knowledge through speaking and writing.

An oral examination gives the graduating student the opportunity to demonstrate his/her knowledge they have gain throughout their educational years thus far.

(You may NOT have notes at the Review).

- Recite the abbreviated 28 Principles of Liberty. The Board will select one or more principles for you to explain or discuss.
- Recite the Preamble to the Constitution
- Give the seven (7) Articles of the Constitution and be prepared to talk about them in general terms.
- Know all of the Bill of Rights and can explain them
- Briefly give a general outline of the chronological history of the United States.
- Recite from memory a poem of your choice (not the one used for Shakespeare Day recitation)
- Choose two classics you have read, that you liked, and be prepared to tell why and how the books was so influential that they changed your life.
- Discuss a Shakespeare play, its meaning and impact on your life
- Be prepared to discuss two great men or women of me past you have studied. What were their accomplishments? What qualities did they have that you would incorporate into your life?
- Bring to the Oral Board an essay on -What I have learned at American Heritage Academy. If you do not have the paper there will be no board held.
